HDNA Net Set Go Umpires How To

Thank you for stepping up and umpiring Net Set Go this upcoming season. Umpiring Net Set Go is a little different to how you would umpire juniors. You are there to guide the players, play a second coaching role as well as keeping the game flowing. Remember to have fun! If you have fun the players will want to continue playing netball.



Expected	Sign in at control 20 minutes before your game.

What to	White umpires top (collared), white jacket (when needed)
wear	Black or White bottoms: Tracksuit Pants, Leggings, Shorts or Skirts.
	Please NO grey or other colours, Bike shorts not permitted.
Pre-Match	• Ensure both teams have a size 4 match ball to play with – most teams will want to play
Tasks	a half each with their teams match ball, check both balls are good for the game.
	Players are to have no jewellery on (no taped earrings) and nails are short and smooth
	 Spectators are to be CLEAR of the goal line unless seated in the stands – HDNA
	executive will also be monitoring this.
	Organise a toss between the teams two captains. Scissors, paper, rock is accepted

Rules to focus on (different for NSG)		
Held Ball Rule 11.4 pg. 44	Players can hold the ball up to 5 seconds , pull the player up if the ball is held longer than 5 seconds, when explaining the rule to the players ensure also to add that the ball should be released within 3 seconds .	
Short Pass Rule 12. 1 & 2 pg. 46	 The ball must be thrown (not handed) to another player If two players from the same team gain possession of the ball in quick succession, this isn't considered to a short pass 	
Replay Rule 11.7 pg. 45	Should only be penalised if a play bounces the ball basketball style multiple times to gain possession. As well as other forms of replay (rule 11.7) All Players Remind and correct replay for the duration of the game during round 1 . (No turn over) Round 2 – If a reply occurs award the free pass to the opposing team (all age groups).	
Stepping/Footwork Rule 13.1,2,3 pg. 48-49	ALL players are allowed to shuffle on the spot once the ball is caught, if they run with the ball the following should occur: Here is a good teaching moment – when play is happening remind players (without using your whistle) to keep their feet still! A phrase to use could also be, have sticky feet!	
	Go Divisions: First quarter remind players of the rule, quarters 2-4 award free pass. From game 1 and will occur for the full season. (You may also need to remind the coaches of this as well)	
	Set Divisions: Round 1: For the full game remind and correct (without turning over) about the stepping rule. Round 2: First half of the game remind and correct (without turning over) the players of the rule, second half award free passes – if you feel the players are of a lower skill level (are struggling with stepping) in the first half continue to remind them about stepping for the full game.

In the 'Go' Divisions, you are likely to have two umpires per court. The same responsibilities apply as per standard Netball Rules regarding areas of control (sideline, goal line etc). This is to replicate what they will have on a Saturday when they move up to the 10's divisions.

In the 'Set' Divisions, there may only be one umpire per court. You can walk on the court with the players and coach them as you go. You do not have to stay off the court on the sideline. Stay with the play, but do not get too involved in the play. You will have better communication with the players this way.

If you have any questions or issues at your court on a Friday Night, please contact Hannah or send someone to Control. Hannah or an Umpires Committee representative will come and assist you. When in doubt, ask! It's better to come get us DURING the game so we can help in the moment, not afterwards.

During the week (including Friday morning) if you are unavailable to umpire, please contact your club convenors. If you are suddenly unavailable to umpire after 2pm, contact Hannah **AND** your club convenor.
